Background



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Statutory Requirements

Government Code requires LAFCO to periodically review, and as appropriate update, the spheres of influence for cities and special districts.



Purpose of a Sphere of Influence

Reflects the Commission's determination of an agency's probable future boundary and service area — the principal planning framework for boundary changes and out-of-agency service extensions.



June 15, 2026 Service Review

Evaluated governance, financial condition, service capacity, and future service needs of the City of Carlsbad and the Carlsbad MWD.

Staff Recommendation 1

Reaffirm Existing Spheres of Influence



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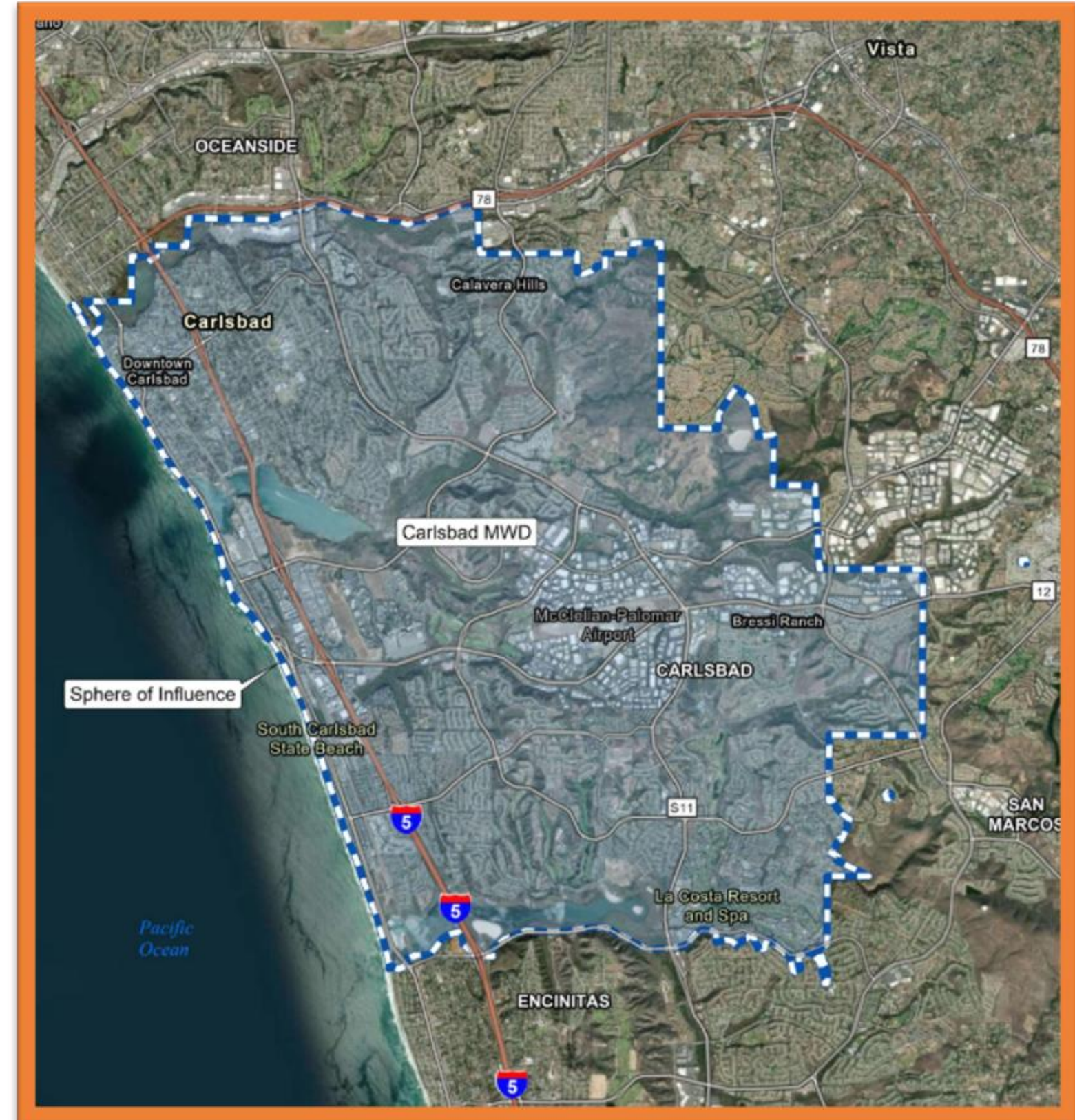
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Establish New Special Study Area



One Special Study Area—three subareas—identified where jurisdictional boundaries & service relationships don't align (~ 123 acres)

- Recognizes locations where future jurisdictional consideration may be appropriate.
- Does not modify jurisdictional boundaries, transfer service responsibilities, or predetermine future Commission action.
- Would allow the Commission to consider concurrent sphere and jurisdictional changes later without a new service review.

3

Make a general rule exemption finding under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3).

Direct Executive Officer to administratively record the sphere actions after the 30-day reconsideration period.

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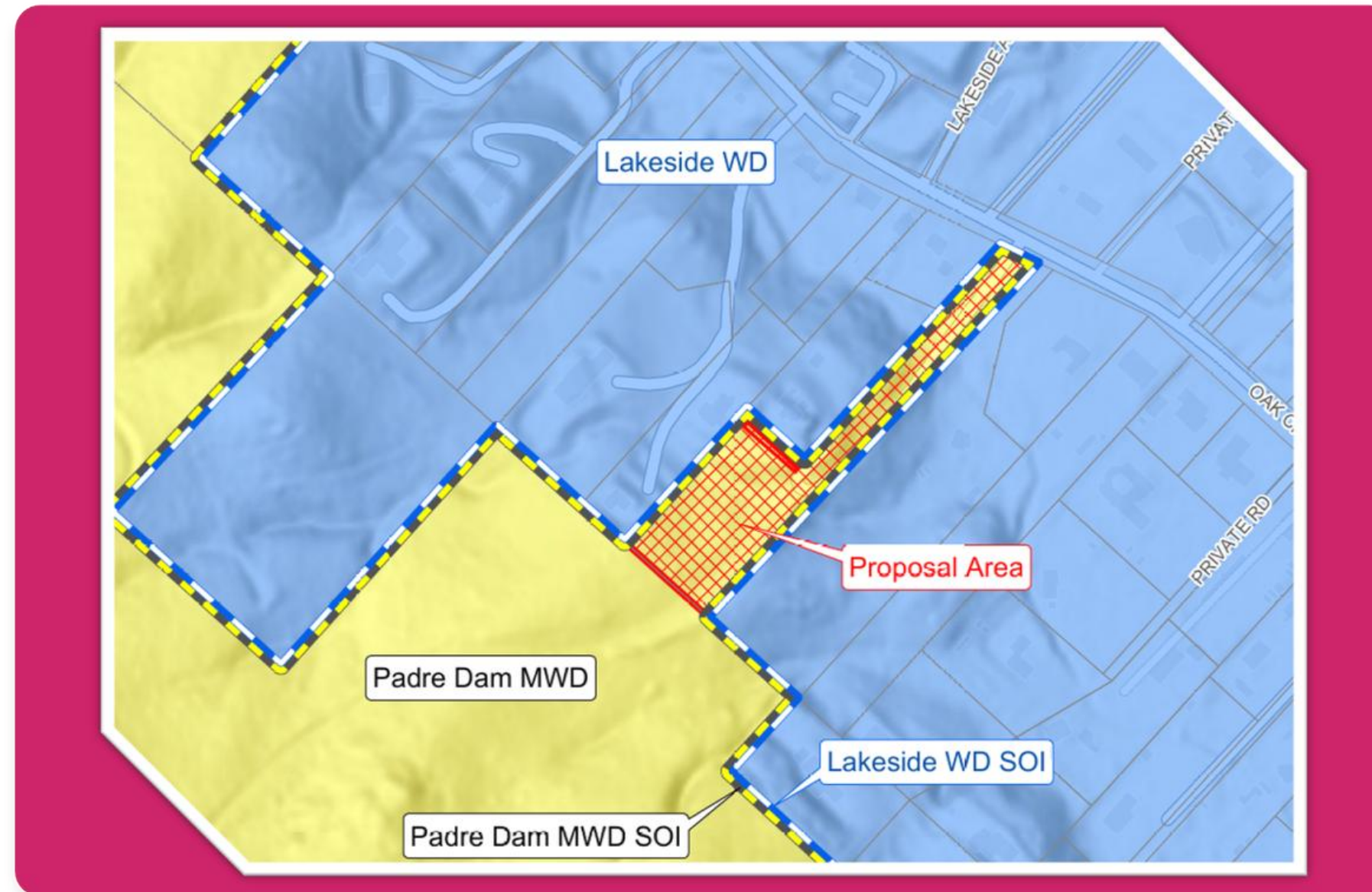
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Turner - Oak Creek Drive Reorganization

- SERVICE CAPACITY**
Lakeside WD Main ~10 Ft From Property Line
- FINANCIAL RESOURCES**
Lakeside WD Has Adequate Financial Resources & Unaffected By Extending Service
- ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE**
Extends Regulated Public Drinking Water To An Area With Elevated Drinking-water Contaminant Levels

Youkhanna (0.05 acres) – To align the district boundary with the existing property

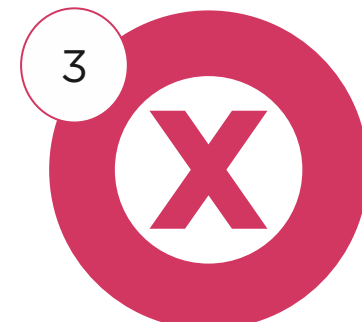

Fund Balance Closed at \$1.58 Million



The year-end decrease is a product of Commission action, not an operating deficiency.

The draw-down on the fund balance was authorized in two parts.

\$63,132 was authorized in adopting the FY 2024-25 budget to moderate the increase in member agency apportionments, and a fourth-quarter amendment authorized an additional \$119,246 for professional services costs. Actual use finished \$52,407 below the \$182,378 authorized. The closing balance remains above the eleven-year average of \$1,539,984.



Net Position and Two Uncorrected Misstatements

Neither misstatement affects the auditor's opinion or requires a change to the audited statements.

Includes accrued long-term liabilities, primarily employee retirement costs.

- Restatement of beginning net position for GASB Statement No. 101: -\$40,959
- Current-year decrease: -\$24,175

Uncorrected Misstatements Totaling \$12,500

\$2,500 · Accounts payable timing

An invoice recorded entirely in FY25 that covered service days in the following year. Reverses on its own in FY26.

\$10,000 · Payroll tax on accrued leave

Newly reportable under GASB Statement No. 101. Staff will record it as part of the FY26 close.

Immaterial individually, and in the aggregate as a whole.

Unrestricted fund balance, FY2015 through FY2025.



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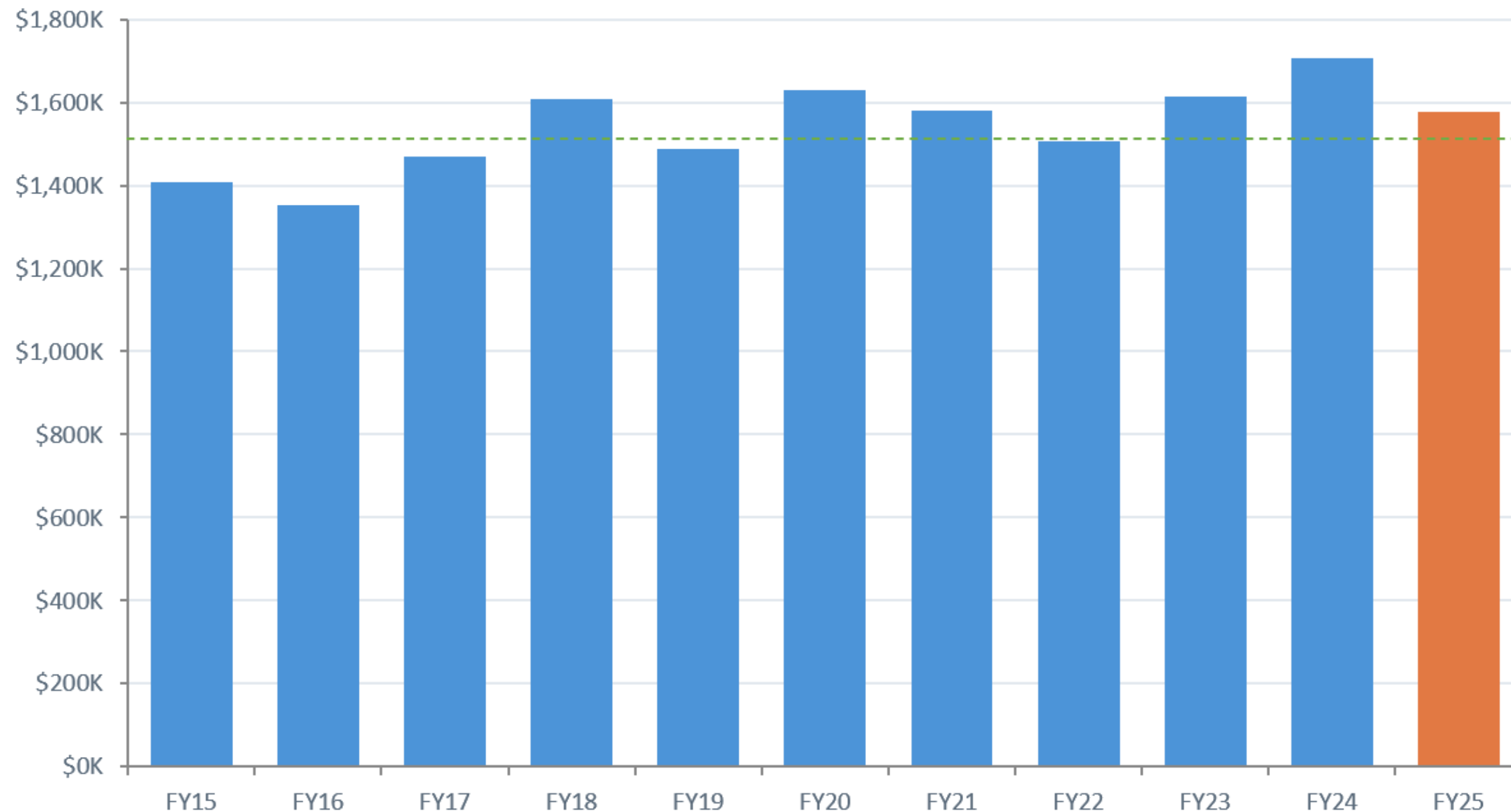
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Pretty Consistent...

\$1,539,984

Eleven-year average

Range across 11 years:

- Low of \$1,352,724 (FY16) to high of \$1,707,948 (FY24)
- FY25 closes at \$1,577,977 – above the eleven-year average

Context: 11 Years of Net Position

Net position moves with long-term liabilities and accounting standards more than with operations.



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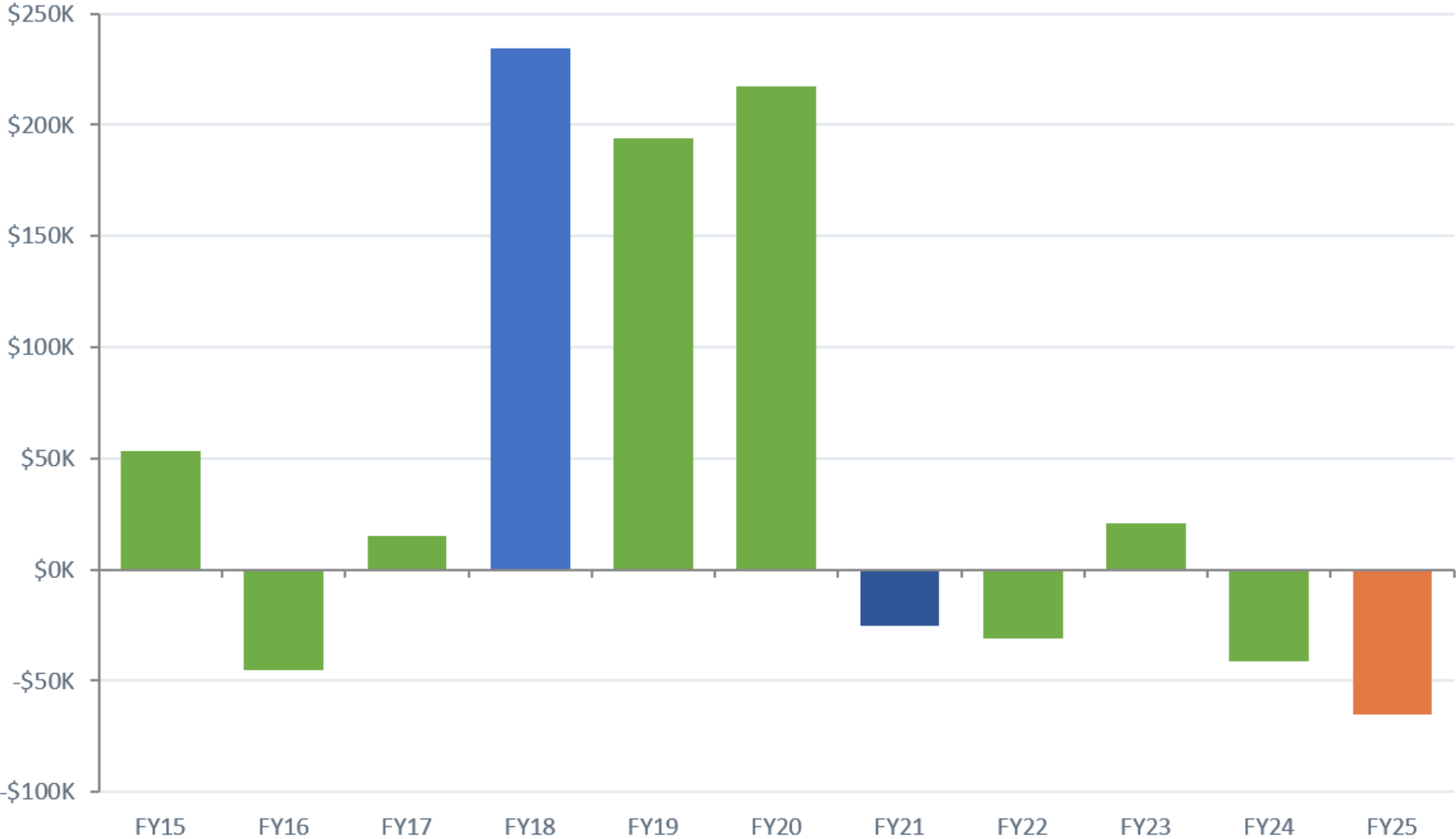
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Key Changes

FY18 **A Sizeable Improvement**
Attributed to the operating net coupled with a sizeable decrease in long-term liabilities, specifically compensated absences.

FY21 **Retiree Liabilities Reassigned**
The change is attributed to a 31% increase in LAFCO's assigned portion of retiree liabilities by the San Diego County Employees Retirement Association.

FY25 **GASB 101 Implementation**
A \$40,959 restatement of beginning net position plus a \$24,175 current-year decrease.

 - Years 3-5:
